The board has to make sure that the associations are run properly, and staff are accountable through reports and presentations made to the Boards.

Being a board member does not mean you have to be an expert in everything to do with Housing, finance, performance and risk management and the other things, within the scope of the responsibilities of the Boards.

What you do need is:

- Time to attend meeting and seminars held during the year. Generally 8 in total. Board meetings are held in the evening.
- Time and ability to read papers sent to you in connection with Board meetings
- The ability to separate personal concerns from the responsibility to take part in decision making affecting the interests of all customers and their communities
- An ability to form constructive relationships with other Board members and senior staff employed by the association.
- The confidence to give you view, but ultimately comply with the majority decision.
